

NOTICE

Please be aware if you have **any** of these conditions it is unlikely you will qualify for DOT Certification and the cost of the DOT physical may not be covered by your employer/potential employer and will become your financial responsibility.

Based on DOT regulations § 391.45 Drivers will likely not meet DOT requirements if they have any of the following medical conditions that are likely to interfere with ability to control and drive a commercial motor vehicle safely.

- Loss of a foot, a leg, a hand, or an arm, without being granted a Skill Performance Evaluation (SPE) Certification
- Has impairment of:
 - i. A hand or finger which interferes with grasping ; or
 - ii. An arm, foot, or leg which interferes with the ability to perform normal tasks associated with operating a commercial motor vehicle;
- Diabetes currently requiring insulin for control; (Does not apply to Victoza or Byetta)
- Cardiovascular disease
- Uncontrolled high blood pressure
- Epilepsy or any other condition which is likely to cause loss of consciousness
- Loss of vision greater than 20/40 in either eye
- Hearing loss in both ears not meeting DOT standard
- Uses a controlled substance indentified in 21 CFR 1308.11 Schedule I, and amphetamine, a narcotic, or any other habit-forming drug **will** require a letter from their prescribing licensed practitioner.
- Alcoholism
